ANNUAL MEETING – OFFICIAL MINUTES
March 11th, 2025

The Town of May held its Annual Meeting on March 11, 2025 at the May Town Hall. Township officials present included: Steve Magner, Don Rolf, and Clerk/Treasurer Bobbi Hummel. Invited Speakers present included Washington County Commissioner Fran Miron and Linda Madsen from Lakes Center for Youth & Families. Supervisor John Pazlar was absent. This meeting was open to all and May Township residents were identified with voting powers. Clerk Hummel called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m.

Election of Moderator

Clerk Hummel asked for nominations from the audience for moderator of the annual meeting. Steve Magner moved, seconded by Don Rolf, to nominate and elect resident Ann Warner as moderator of the Annual Meeting. All in favor. Motion passed.

2024 Annual Meeting Minutes, Waive, and Accept

The 2024 Annual Meeting Minutes were posted on the website for review and copies were available at the meeting. Ms. Warner asked for a motion to read the minutes or waive the reading of the minutes and accept. Magner moved, seconded by Rolf, to waive the reading of the minutes and accept the minutes as presented. All in favor. Motion Passed.

2024 Financial Report, Reading or Waive, and Accept

The 2024 Financial Report was posted on the township's website in advance of the meeting. Resident motioned, seconded by resident, to accept the 2024 Financial Report as presented. All in favor. Motion passed.

Lakes Center for Youth and Families

Linda Matson, Community Outreach Coordinator for Lakes Center for Youth and Families presented information on the benefits and resources for local May Township residents and surrounding communities. The 2026 proposed levy includes the same support of \$2500.00 to Lakes Center for Youth and \$2500.00 to Stillwater Youth Service Bureau. Motion and seconded to allocate \$5000.00. All in favor. Motion passed.

Washington County Updates

County Commissioner Miron was in attendance. He updated on projects relevant to May Township residents, including Big Marine Park Reserve, Keystone Woods, and Washington County Long Range Transportation Plan.

Proposed Tax Levy 2026

The proposed 2026 levy was mailed to residents in the annual newsletter as well as published on the township's website. The Town Board reviewed/approved the proposed 2026 tax levy at \$1,162,844, a 5.24% increase from the 2024 tax levy.

Motion and second to approved the 2027 levy as presented. All in favor. Motion passed.

Legal Newspaper

The township's legal newspaper is the *Country Messenger*. Motion and second to continue using the *Country Messenger* as the town's legal newspaper. All in favor. Motion passed.

Gopher Bounty

Hummel reported that in 2024, the town paid \$0.00 in gopher bounty. Resident moved, seconded by resident, to continue the gopher bounty at \$1.50 per pair of front feet. All in favor. Motion passed.

Set Time and Place for 2026 Annual Meeting

The 2026 Annual Meeting will be on Tuesday, March 10, 2026 at 8:30 p.m. at the May Town Hall.

Resident motion and second to adjourn the meeting. By Roll Call Vote: ALL YES. Motion passed.
